GENERAL INFORMATION

This area is for home gardeners only – persons who earn a living selling produce are excluded. Exhibitors should keep in mind that attractiveness of displays and exhibits is important. All vegetables should be cleaned and free of dust. All vegetables such as carrots, beets, parsnips, etc., should be topped. Do not cover rhubarb, etc. ends with foil. Show sweet corn in husks. Avoid over skinning of dry onions. It is generally not advisable to wash vegetables and potatoes in water in preparation of exhibiting, but if done in such a way that the exhibit is not skinned, the exhibit will not be disqualified. Indicate the variety names of your exhibits. This information adds to the educational value of your exhibit.

Garden displays shall be arranged by the exhibitor and attractiveness and beauty of the exhibit shall be considered in judging. Avoid putting in freaks or oversized vegetables. Remember that the food value and variety of vegetables and fruits in the exhibit, as well as the quality, will be the basis on which these displays are judged.

Entries must be submitted between the hours of 11:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. on entry day, Wednesday, August 10, 2011, and must be picked up at 5 p.m. on the final day of the fair. Pre-registration greatly speeds up the entry process. Exhibitors with a large number of exhibits are encouraged to arrive early to avoid congestion. Late entries will not be accepted. All exhibitors are asked to come prepared with written entry information appropriate to category.
